UCSB Technology Management Program and 2008 Winners of the New Venture Competition

UCSB's Technology Management Program (TMP) is an intensive, campus-wide certificate program that prepares students to be successful technology entrepreneurs. Each year, TMP students may participate in the annual New Venture Competition. The rigorous New Venture Competition lasts six months, and winners receive cash prizes for most fundable business plans. Past winners include Inogen and Datapoint. Katheryn Greenaway, UCSB TMP Program Manager, will provide an introduction to UCSB's TMP and to the New Venture Competition. Two of 2008's winners also speak.

Sherrie Robert, CEO, InFlowMed. InFlowMed is a medical software company that provides adverse drug event prevention software to hospitals. When a physician electronically prescribes (eRx) a medication, InFlowMed's software, ADEAware, automatically checks for harmful drug interactions based on the patient's medical history contained in an electronic medical record (EMR).



Troy Baker, Founder and CTO, Nitride Solutions. Nitride Solutions is a Santa Barbara-based start-up that is developing high-efficiency LEDs for the UV spectrum. Baker will discuss the business plan of Nitride Solutions, including the technology of LEDs, the future of UV LEDs, and the market opportunities for UV emitters. He will also cover the process and challenges of developing university research into an operational company.
